Getting here by Train

Castleknock Railway Station is located approximately 20 minutes walk away from the ITB. The station is located on the Dublin to Sligo railway line. During a weekday, 40 services per day stop at Castleknock Railway Station; the earliest train is at 05:46 and the last train is at 23:33. Access to Castleknock Railway Station is available by bicycle or using the 38 or URBUS buses.

There are a total of 587 car parking spaces at the ITB, including 15 mobility impaired car parking spaces.

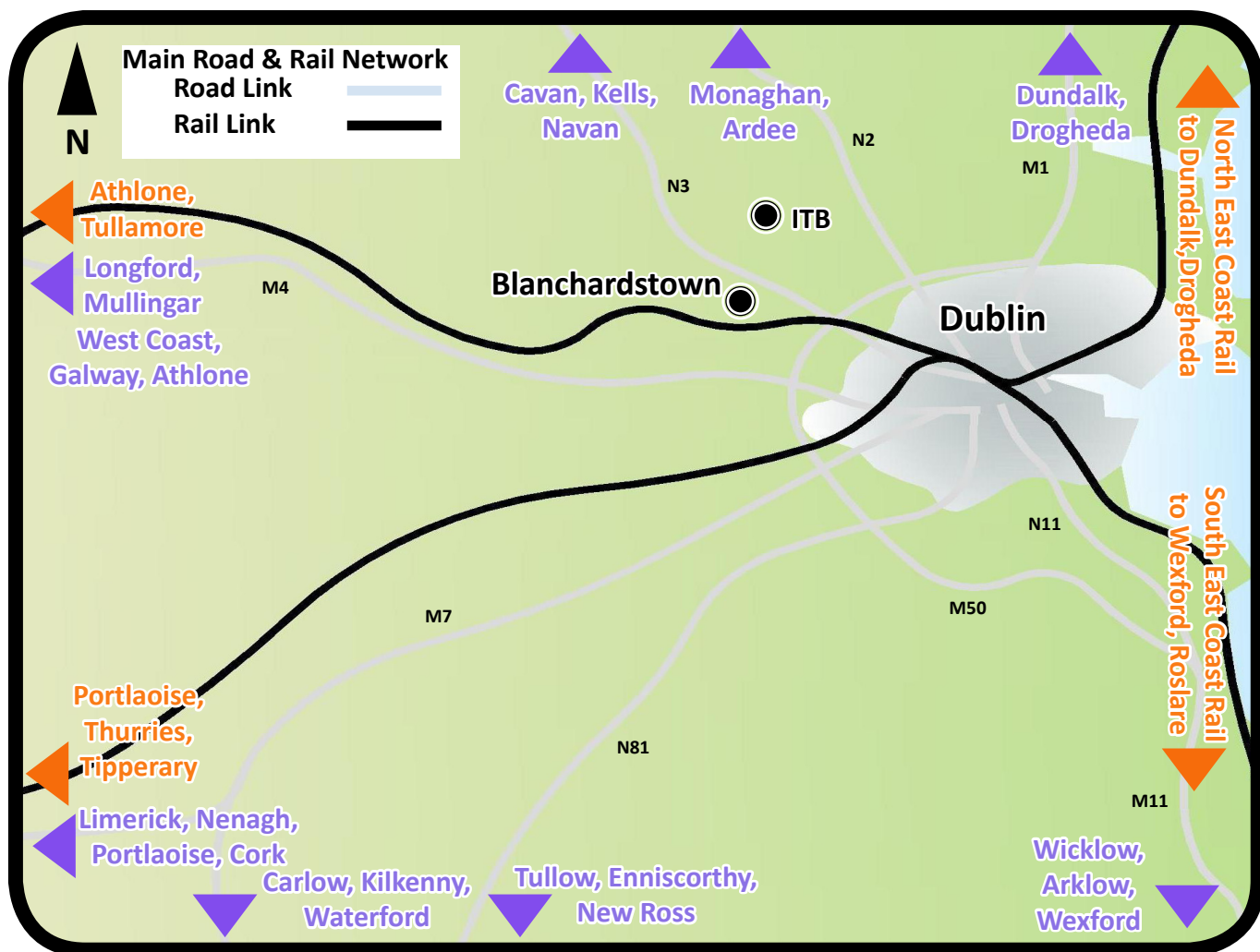
Getting here by Bicycle

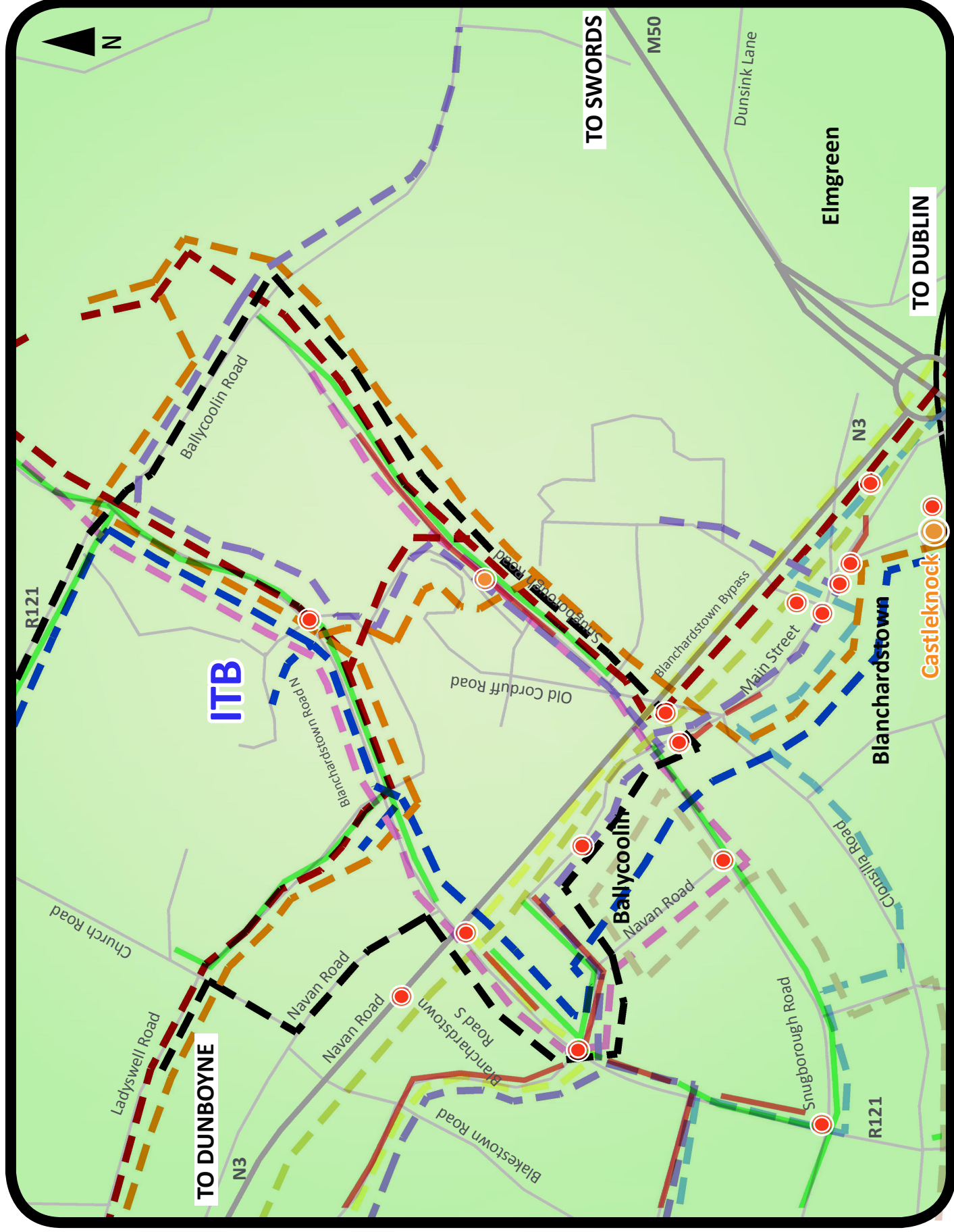
